



- Increase # of providers and social service professionals who treat/identify SUD/OUD through professional development and
- **Reduce Treatment Barriers**
- Improve ID/Screening for SUD/OUD; provide referrals to providers, harm reduction, early intervention, treatment,
- Train Providers and Admin staff to optimize reimbursement for treatment through proper coding/billing across insurances to ensure service provider

Support development of recovery communities, recovery coaches, and recovery community organizations to expand the availability of and access to recovery support services

Grant Spending Boundaries: Funds must be spent to address work ONLY in our rural census tracts





SHC's Stated Focus for Work Plan

Snohomish Health District and the Consortium's focus is to achieve the following while

observing the HRSA RCORP-Implementation grant's boundaries and required activities:

- Utilize youth-focused SUD prevention using evidence-based strategies to reduce the rural community morbidity and mortality associated with SUD and OUD
- Work to prevent overdose and infectious complications among people who use drugs
- Increase in the community's capacity to provide effective SUD/OUD treatment
- Ensure a robust recovery support system
- Provide community education on substance use disorder, mental health issues, and treatment options to address stigma and other barriers individuals face in accessing critical services.





SnoCo's Opioid Response Landscape Updates

Currently a surge of momentum is being generated on the political landscape:

- June 6, 2023, Herald Article by the opioid crisis Monday to push for a unified response to soaring overdoses.
- May 24, 2023, <u>New Law on Drug Position, Use Take Effect July 1st, 2023</u>
- May 17, 2023, Herald Article County releases new 2- part, 'holistic' plan for opioid, fentanyl crisis
- May 18, 2023, SnoCo **Executive Directive re: Opioid Epidemic/Dave Somers**
- May 13, 2023, Herald Article On front lines of fentanyl crisis, Somers mourns brother's overdose
- May 12, 2023, Seattle Times **Understanding the Personal Cost of the Drug Crisis**

South Tract: (Sky Valley Corridor): Self-noted Needs and Momentum

- **Transportation to Facilitate Service Connection** from frontier rural areas to in-county services See Proposal Contract ETA: Mid July to Aug 2023
- Peer Outreach Specialist to expand service access in fronter rural areas by raising awareness of and supporting navigation to service options. <u>See Proposal</u> Contract ETA: Mid July to Aug 2023
- **Continued Naloxone Distribution in rural tract –** ETA for Naloxone Supply?

North & South Tract: Collaboratively Explore, Possibly Plan and Implement

- and substance use and provide naloxone distribution and training.
- Food Banks, Transit, EMS, NSCS, DPICC, local health providers, etc.
- stakeholder response to the County's opioid epidemic.

Community Engagement events (Fall '23/ Spring '24) in each rural community that bring a panel of community members / county stakeholders together to explore the topics of stigma related to mental health

Activate and support intentional two-way communication and insight-gathering/sharing, between rural community members/stakeholders and relevant efforts including the Countywide Opioid Epidemic Response and integration of the impacts of SB 5536, through the continued deepening of relationships and awareness with rural community stakeholders including: Mayors, City Councils, School Districts, Libraries,

Campaign: Explore funding/execution of Billboard Campaign along Sky Valley Corridor that builds on the earlier stigma reduction campaign research/execution and uses positive messaging to support collective




