






Behavioral Health Service Continuum

Memorandum of Understanding between North Sound Region Participating Local Governments and North Sound Behavioral Health Administrative Services Organization

Agreement:

3. The OAC shall be composed of one representative of each participating county and one city representative per county. The participating cities within each county shall choose one individual to represent all of the cities within that county.

One Washington Agreement

Distributors Washington Settlement | Washington State Attorney General Bob Ferguson worked with Prosecuting Attorneys throughout the state on an allocation agreement for Opioid Settlement dollars. This is referred to as the One Washington Memorandum of Understanding between the Washington Municipalities (One Washington for short).

In total, 125 eligible local governments (counties and cities with populations over 10,000 people) will receive funding over a 17 year period.

Approved Purposes

- 1. Treat opioid use disorder (OUD).
- 2. Support people in treatment and recovery.
- 3. Connect people who need help to the help they need (Connections to Care).
- 4. Address the needs of criminal-justice-involved persons.
- 5. Address the needs of pregnant or parenting women and their families, including babies with neonatal abstinence syndrome.
- 6. Prevent over-prescribing and ensure appropriate prescribing and dispensing of opioids.
- 7. Prevent misuse of opioids.
- 8. Prevent overdose deaths and other harms.
- 9. First Responders (related to the opioid epidemic)
- 10. Leadership, planning and coordination (related to the opioid epidemic)
- **11**. Training (related to the opioid epidemic)
- 12. Research (related to the opioid epidemic)










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
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Required Core Grant Activities

- Improve ID/Screening for SUD/OUD; provide referrals to providers, harm reduction, early intervention, treatment,
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


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




Opioid Systems Map



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
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
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




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








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
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


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




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
